Epiphany of the Lord

This weekend we celebrate the climax of the season of Christmas, the feast of the Epiphany. This is about so much that one can never do justice to it in a homily or a newsletter piece. But one thing it is about is the gathering in of all nations and peoples to worship the Christ child in the manger. Epiphany is a direct challenge to shabby nationalism and racism, so prevalent in our world and in this sad country.

Here at St Mark's we will be beginning this month and this year a new way to affirm what Epiphany is about. From Sunday 19 January there will be an additional Sunday Mass here, initially every fortnight, at 3pm (for some of the background to the work of the chaplaincy go to https://www.indcatholicnews.com/news/10971.

Thanks to a request from one of our parishioners, and with the approval of the archbishop, we will be hosting a regular Sunday Mass organised by the Congolese chaplaincy in London. This will be celebrated in French and Lingala. All are welcome to these Masses which will fulfil the Sunday obligation - we haven't had a Sunday evening Mass in West Wickham for some years. As far as I am aware there are few celebrations of Mass in our diocese in either French or Lingala so we hope that these celebrations will be a good way of welcoming French-speaking African Catholics to St Mark's, and contribute to how we celebrate the diversity of our archdiocese.



Moreover, in West Wickham this regular celebration will be making an important statement about the Catholic community here. I have not been in West Wickham long enough to comment about other churches here, but I do know that in Beckenham, where I served for twenty-seven years, St Edmund's parish was much more diverse, in terms of the backgrounds of worshippers, than many other churches; and I suspect (though I don't know) that this might be true in West Wickham. The Catholic Church really is the 'Church of all Nations' and this initiative gives us all an opportunity to witness to this in West Wickham. These Masses are not simply for Francophone Catholics with a Congolese heritage - they will be part of the ministry of our parish and all will be welcome.
